Tilted Tiara Terrific Classic

\$2,000 Prize Money

Open to all riders. This class is designed as a combined jumper and dressage class and will be run as part of the Wild Rose Show. Sponsored by Rocky Mountain Show Jumping and Show Jumping Canada.

The class will be run with two rounds, the first round will be a short dressage test in the upper ring, the second round will be a jumper style round in the lower ring.

The Top 8 winners will be placed from combined scores from Phase 1 & Phase 2 for an overall placing. Prize money will be awarded to the top eight horses. Medals and prize money will be awarded at Goby's Grill Friday evening following the competition.

Triple Crown Horse Cup



The Tilted Tiara Triple Crown is a competition for the dressage horse. The dressage horse must compete in at least two of the four fun Wild Rose classes: Champagne Class, Costume Class, Road Hack, and Pole Bending plus at least two Dressage Tests ridden at Tilted Tiara II. The horse with the highest accumulated points will win the **Tilted Tiara Triple Crown Horse Cup**.

Canadian Warmblood Breeders Incentive

\$600 Prize Money

The Canadian Warmblood Breeder Association Alberta Chapter is sponsoring a Young Horse Class for Alberta bred 4 and 5 year old Canadian Warmblood registered horses. The class fee is covered through sponsorship of the CWHBA. The CWHBA Alberta Chapter upon receipt of the class results will split \$600 between the owner/rider and breeders of the top 4 and 5 year old horse.

Gold General Information

The Tilted Tiara II Competition is sanctioned as a: Gold competition of Equestrian Canada, 11 Hines, Suite 201, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged accordance with the EC Rule Book.

An Equestrian Canada Gold (or higher) Membership, and an AEF membership are required for the rider. Fees should be paid to Equestrian Canada – www.equestrian.ca and AEF – www.albertaequestrian.com respectively. Horses must also have an Equestrian Canada horse recording, or temporary horse licence.

Wild Rose General Information

The Tilted Tiara II Competition is also sanctioned as Alberta Wild Rose Competition. EC tests are being offered at the Wild Rose Show. Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose-sanctioned competitions are to be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Rules. An AEF membership is required to show in the Wild Rose Show. Fees should be paid to AEF – www.albertaequestrian.com.

EC memberships for the horse or the rider are not required if you are entering only Wild Rose classes.

Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions, and;
- Actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments

Entry Information

1. Entries must be received by July 21, 2022 with full payment. There are three ways to enter the shows:
 - **Equestrian Entries online for your entries at www.equestrianentries.com.** This option allows the use of a credit card to pay for your entries. Equestrian entries do charge a fee for this service.

Gold licence Information

2. EC Gold Sport licences are required for the rider and the owner of the horse.
3. The competitor or owner may pay a fee of \$21 to compete at the Gold Show if they hold a valid Silver licence, or a fee of \$43 to compete at a Gold Show if they hold a valid Bronze licence. The single event Sport licence Upgrade is valid only for that competition.
4. Non-Equestrian Canada members will be permitted to exhibit in the Gold Show with the purchase of a Temporary Sport licence at a cost of \$73. A Temporary Sport licence is not accumulative and will not apply against payment of a full licence. Only Equestrian Canada members holding a valid competition licence are eligible to receive Equestrian Canada Annual Awards.
5. Note: At Gold shows in Alberta, persons who want to purchase a Temporary Sport or Horse licence have to show proof of an AEF membership.
6. Canadian horses competing in an EC Gold show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete, a temporary Horse Registration form may be purchased. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. Foreign horses will be allowed to compete upon submitting an Affidavit for Foreign-Owned Horses to the Show Office.

Wild Rose licence Information

7. Entries in the Wild Rose show only do not need EC Sport licences for the rider or EC Horse Recordings for the horse. The rider does require an AEF (or other Provincial) membership. Tests ridden in the Wild Rose classes are not eligible for Equestrian Canada awards.

Rules

8. Entries for the show will be processed in the order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championship rules limiting a competition's right to refuse entries. A805.
9. Riders may pay one administration fee and enter both Gold and Wild Rose classes.

10. The Masters Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginner to advanced. The class will feature one test per day. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.
11. Please submit your Freestyle Music when registering and the music must be electronic, please email to the show secretary and/or provide an iPod/iPad/iPhone/Android/USB device with the music.
12. Gold entries must pay a mandatory DC Levy of \$10.
13. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5). The drug fee is \$7. This only applies to Gold horses.
14. Late entries will be accepted, space permitting with a late fee.
15. Post entries, to fill scratches will be allowed if scheduling permits. To be eligible for post entry, the horse/rider must already be registered in the show as either a competing or non-competing horse and must register with the show secretary.
16. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person(s) responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a person(s) responsible signature.
17. Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.
18. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees. Entrants are subject to EC or AEF rules and Hors Concours entries are not eligible for ribbons or awards.
19. Non-competing (schooling horses) will be accepted. Entries must pay a non-competing horse fee and stabling fees. Schooling horses do not require a horse recording. Riders must have proof of AEF or provincial membership.
20. Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded.
21. Cancellations after the closing date and prior to Tuesday at 1pm before the show will have the stabling fees, RV hookup, EC fees and 50% of the class fees refunded. The administration fees and 50% of the class fees will not be refunded.
22. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before the first class the horse is competing in. The name of the horse, any required licences and owner or person(s) responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time the substitution is made.
23. All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (E.4.0).
24. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.
25. The horse may compete at any level up to a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle e.g. one horse could compete on a total of four technical tests, with two different riders each riding two tests. The horse may compete only in two consecutive levels. Horses competing at second level and above can only compete in a total of three technical tests per day, including the freestyle.

26. There will be no test readers provided by the show.
27. Every entry will have an identification number which must be worn and visible at all times on the show grounds.
28. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes. (E9.10.7)
29. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

1st - 60% or higher
2nd - 57% to 59.9%
3rd - 54% to 56.9%
4th - 51% to 53.9%

No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4 position. (E9.9.10)

30. Class ribbons, tests and show championships will be distributed at the show office in a Covid safe manner. The show office will ensure that contact will be limited and that riders can get their tests safely.
31. Class ribbons for EC and FEI technical tests will be given to 6th place by category of rider (Amateur, Junior, Open). Class ribbons for Freestyle classes will be given to 6th place with all riders in the class grouped together.
32. Warm up in the show rings is allowed on move in day from 1:30PM until 7:30PM. Horses that are not stabled on the grounds may also haul-in on move in day and school in the show rings. Schooling in the show rings is also allowed for one hour after the last rider in that ring on the first show day. Longeing is only allowed in the dedicated longeing area.
33. There will be one warm up area, situated beside the show rings. The warm up area is open starting one hour before the show opens each day, and for one hour at the end of the first show day.
34. Show correspondence will be handed through email and Fox Village. Ride times will be posted on the Fox Village website once they are ready, and an email will be sent to riders and owners once the times are posted. Ride times will also be posted at the show office. Riders are responsible for checking the day sheets as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry form.
35. It is a condition of entry that neither the show organizing committee, nor Rocky Mountain Show Jumping will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors.
36. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Smoking is not allowed in the stabling areas or indoor arena.
37. Horses must leave the show grounds within 2 hours of classes ending on the last day of the show. Any arrangements to stay extra time must be made in advance with RMSJ.
38. A protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those specific matters covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, and owner, lessee, trainer, coach competitor or authorized agent, in the division in which the question arises; b) a protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. For full details see rule A1204 Gen. Regulations.

39. All parking is across the road from the Show Grounds. No exceptions except during trailer loading and unloading.

Championships

41. The average of all Gold and Wild Rose tests ridden will be used to determine the Show Champions and Reserve Champions. At least two (2) tests must be ridden to be eligible for show championships. The highest average will be used to determine the Show Champion, the second highest average will be used to determine the Show Reserve Champion. Freestyle, FEI Young Horse and Materiale classes do not count towards Show Championships. TOC classes do count towards Show Championships.

- ★ Junior - average all tests
- ★ Adult Amateur Intro & Training - average all EC introductory and training tests
- ★ Adult Amateur - average all EC 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th levels
- ★ Adult Amateur FEI - average all FEI tests
- ★ Masters Dressage Rider - average all tests Adult Amateur age 60 and above
- ★ Open - average all EC tests above introductory
- ★ Open FEI - average all FEI tests

Triple Crown Horse Cup

42. The accumulated points from at least two of the fun Wild Rose classes: Champagne Class, Costume Class, Road Hack and Pole Bending plus the two highest scoring dressage tests from Tilted Tiara II. The fun classes will count towards 50% of the total points, and the dressage tests 50% of the total points.

The horse with the highest accumulated points at the end of the show will be named the Tilted Tiara Triple Crown Horse.

Tilted Tiara Terrific Classic (\$2,000)

43. The Terrific Classic class will be scheduled at the end of the day on Friday.
44. Riders will ride a dressage test in the upper ring. Following the dressage test, the rider will enter the jumper ring, and ride a jumper round. Riders will be allowed to ride with a running martingale, and the riders are permitted to stop between phases to shorten stirrups. There is no time allocated to change tack. The class is judged 50% over fences and 50% on the dressage test. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. In phase 1 of the class a short custom dressage test, with walk, trot and canter will be ridden. ~~The dressage movements will be equivalent to a training level test.~~ In phase 2 of the competition (the jumping round) scoring will be based on speed match the clock while minimizing knockdowns. One (1) point will be subtracted from the rider's score for each commenced second taken over or under the time allowed and four (4) points will be deducted for each knockdown on course. Fences will not exceed 18" high and there will be no jumps in combinations or spreads.

Prize money will be allocated as follows: \$440 - \$360 - \$310 - \$260 - \$200 - \$160 - \$140 - \$130

Following the Terrific Classic Class, the medal presentation and prize money will be awarded at Goby's Grill. All horse show participants and sponsors are invited to the medal presentations and celebration on Friday evening.

Canadian Warmblood Incentive Class (\$600)

45. The Alberta Chapter of the Canadian Warmblood Association is sponsoring a Young Horse class for Alberta bred four and five year old Canadian Warmblood registered horses. The horses will ride the dressage test of their choosing and results will be submitted to the Canadian Warmblood Association. The Alberta Chapter of the Canadian Warmblood Association will split \$600 between the rider/owner and the breeder of the top 4 Year Old and 5 Year Old horses in the class. The class entry fee is covered by sponsorship from the Canadian Warmblood Association.

Sponsor Event

46. All sponsors are invited to the sponsors tent at the top of Ring One on Friday afternoon. Following the Canadian Warmblood Incentive Class, and some dressage and Triple Crown classes, the day will end with the Terrific Medal class and medal presentations at Goby's Grill.

Stabling

47. Stabling is available but not mandatory. Stabling will open at 1:00pm the day before the show. Shavings will be sold by pre-order on the entry form, at a cost of \$10.50 a bag or by Rocky Mountain Show Jumping at the show office.
48. Two complementary bags of shavings for each stall are being provided by Tilted Tiara.
49. Competitors not stabling will be charged a daily haul in fee. The haul in horses may not tie to stalls in the stabling area, they should be kept by their trailer in the parking area across the road from the show grounds.
50. All horses that are stabled (including day stalls) must pay the mandatory environmental fee.
51. A stabling chart will be provided at the start of the shows. It can be found at the show office and in the barns. Competitors may only use the stall and tack stall assigned to them. Any changes to stabling should be discussed with the show office.
52. If you would like to be stabled next to someone in particular, please ensure that the same stable group name is used on the entry form. When assigning stalls, every attempt will be made to accommodate special requests, but no guarantees can be made.

Rocky Mountain Show Jumping Biosecurity Protocol

Rocky Mountain Show Jumping has implemented a Health & Biosecurity Protocol to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contaminants, contagious or infectious diseases by movements or horses onto or off the venue.

Health Requirements

1. Proof of negative coggins is required and must be dated within the last 12 months.
2. You must provide proof of vaccination and coggins for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not, Required vaccinations are: Equine Influenza and EVH 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months (180 days) but not within 7 days of arrival on the grounds.
3. Keep copies of your vaccination records in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by Rocky Mountain Show Jumping personnel to present your health papers at any time.
4. If you ship in and out daily, keep copies of your vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You may be asked to present these records.
5. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) will be asked to leave the grounds.

Direct and Indirect Contact Between Horses and People

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact.

- Limit horse-to-horse contact.
 - Limit horse-to-human-to-horse contact.
 - Limit horse-to-dog (other animal)-to-horse or horse-to-dog-to-human-to-horse contact.
1. Dogs are permitted in the stabling area only. Dogs must be on a leash controlled by a human. Loose dogs will not be tolerated.
 2. Restrict unnecessary movement of horses out of their aisle or barn.
 3. Do not lead horses down other tent/barn aisles.
 4. Don't let horses make nose-to-nose contact.
 5. Do not touch or pet, or feed treats to horses.

Soiled Equipment

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

1. **Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling.** Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.
2. **Do not allow horses to drink from the hose.**
3. **Do not share water or feed buckets.**

4. **Have hand sanitizer readily available**, and use it between grooming/tacking up horses. Keep it handy in the grooming stall, on your golf cart, and in your grooming box at the ring
5. **Use clean brushes and towels on each horse.** If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.
6. **Don't share tack and equipment**, especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

BIO-SECURITY MEASURES

Protecting the health of your horses is of the utmost importance to Rocky Mountain Show Jumping. Rocky Mountain Show Jumping has compiled this list of Bio-Security Regulations for decreasing the risk of exposure or spread of disease.

1. Be sure to read the Bio-Security regulations, it reviews simple steps we all can take to keep horses healthy!
2. **Horses Temperature** is an easy way to monitor your horse. Take and record your horses temperature twice daily when it is at rest and NOT immediately following exercise and trailering. Horses temperature should be below 102°F
3. Trainers - please let your braider know to about the new Bio-Security regulations.

RMSJ CONTINGENCY PLAN

Monitor your horses and contact TD Equine Veterinary Group at 403-691-9808 if you notice any unusual symptoms. Any sick or suspect horses are to be reported to the veterinary staff and will be separated and taken to isolation stalls for testing and observation.
