# SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

**IMPORTANT CHANGES** have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

### SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

### DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

### AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

### COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

### DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

# Equestrian Canada

## Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

**All persons shall be committed to:**

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

# Gold Competition

## Information

**The Tilted Tiara competition is sanctioned as a: Platinum competition of Equestrian Canada** c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)

"Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book." (A602.2)

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations (A602.8)

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location. (A602.5)

"Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for detail." (A602.6)

To enter a horse in an EC sanctioned competition, you must designate a Person Responsible (PR). The PR must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse, and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR.

Temporary Sport Licences and Horse Recordings are no longer available for purchase.

ALL riders, owners, and coaches must hold at minimum a Bronze Sport Licence (exceptions only in A213).

Single Event Upgrades are available for purchase directly through the competitors MyEC portal. There is a flat rate of \$55 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded. Upgrades are not available to Platinum.

All horses who require a Horse Recording must have a Horse Recording activated prior to the event, Horse Recordings can be purchased digitally via MyEC. There is no alternative temporary option available.

# Wild Rose Competition

## Information

**The Tilted Tiara I Competition is sanctioned as an Alberta Wild Rose Provincial Circuit Competition** and will be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Competition Rulebook.

Every participant at the AEF Wild Rose Competition shall agree that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the competition.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Wild Rose Competition Rulebook and will be judged in accordance with the Rulebook.

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

When registering for Wild Rose sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or indicate they are self-coached.

All horses participating in the Wild Rose provincial circuit competition must have received Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within the last 6 months before the event, with a 21-day grace period, before the event.

**Entries in the Wild Rose show only require an AEF (or other Provincial) membership for the rider.**

All classes in the Wild Rose show are not rated for EC awards.

# Gold & Wild Rose

## General Rules and Regulations

Please review the rules and regulations section carefully as we have made a number of updates for 2026.

**Updates and changes have been highlighted for your convenience.**



1. All entries must be submitted through BlackHorse One. <https://blackhorse-one.com/equestrian-hub>
2. Late entries will be charged a \$50 fee
3. Entries close on May 10, 2026
4. The Participant must review and sign the Tilted Tiara Waiver prior to using any equipment or accessing any facilities including but not limited to: jumping, riding, lunging, hand walking, and any and all other forms of mounted and unmounted equestrian activities.
5. Tilted Tiara Dressage will be gathering photographic and video images and recordings during this event, which images may include the competitor. The competitor agrees that these images and recordings are the sole property of Tilted Tiara Dressage and hereby consent to Tilted Tiara Dressage's release and reproduction of all photographic and video images, recordings and likenesses taken during its events for future promotional or commercial purposes, without any notice or compensation to the competitor.
6. Biosecurity forms must be submitted prior to arrival.
7. Riders or a delegate must come to the show office prior to using any of the facilities to check-in so we ensure all necessary waivers, vaccination records and biosecurity forms have been submitted.
8. Coggins no longer required but highly recommended.
9. Entries for the Gold and Wild Rose shows will be processed in the order they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championship rules limiting a competition's right to refuse entries. A805.
10. The show will try to accommodate dedicated rings for Wildrose and Gold classes if scheduling permits. Gold FEI tests will have a panel of FEI judges. No other commitments for judging panels will be made. Young horse FEI classes will have three FEI YH judges.
11. Riders may pay one administration fee and enter both Gold and Wild Rose classes.
12. The Master's Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginner to advanced. The class will feature one test per day. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available.
13. Please submit your Freestyle Music when registering; the music must be electronic. Please email the show secretary with the music file.
14. Gold entries must pay a mandatory DC Levy of \$12, and a mandatory Drug Fee of \$8.
15. Wild Rose entries must pay a mandatory AEF Levy that will be remitted to the AEF to support their awards program.
16. Gold entries must pay a mandatory ADA Levy that will be remitted to the ADA to support their award program.
17. Late entries will be accepted, space permitting, with a late fee.
18. Post entries to fill scratches, (no change fee), will be allowed if scheduling permits. To be eligible for post-entry into classes, the horse/rider must already be registered as a competing or non-competing horse and must arrange the additional classes with the show secretary.
19. Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.
20. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees. Entrants are subject to EC or AEF rules, and Hors Concours entries are not eligible for ribbons or awards.
21. Non-competing (schooling horses) will be accepted. Entries must pay the administration fee, the schooling fee and stabling fees. Schooling horses do not require a horse recording. Riders must have proof of AEF or provincial membership.
22. Classes may be scheduled at any time on the day listed in the class schedule. Ride times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show.
23. The show will try to accommodate each horse rider combination as best as possible to allow for suitable warm up time for all tests a rider has entered. A minimum of 30 minutes between start of ride times will be scheduled if and where possible. In cases where this is not feasible in the ride schedule, affected riders will be given the option of accepting the available ride time or being removed from the class with a refund for that class.
24. After the ride times are published, riders may request changes to their classes or ride times, which will be allowed only if scheduling permits and the rider pays a \$20 change fee.

25. Riders may scratch their entries by emailing [info@tiltedtiaradressage.com](mailto:info@tiltedtiaradressage.com).

Prior to the closing date, all entry fees will be refunded except the administration fee.

After the closing date and prior to midnight on Tuesday, May 19, stabling and 50% of class fees will be refunded.

Prior to 11:00 am on Thursday, May 21, 50% of class fees will be refunded.

After 11:00am on Thursday, May 21, even with a note from a veterinarian, there will be no refunds issued.

26. RV Parking, Golf Carts and Parking Passes must be booked through the Tilted Tiara website. These services may be cancelled until Thursday at 11:00 am by emailing [info@tiltedtiaradressage.com](mailto:info@tiltedtiaradressage.com).

A 25% restocking fee will be assessed when refunds are issued for RV Parking Golf Carts and Parking Passes.

27. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before the horse competes in their class. The name of the horse, any required licences and the owner or person(s) responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary when the substitution is made.

28. All athletes, including those riding in Western Dressage classes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted.

29. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.

30. Gold: Each horse is limited to a maximum of three (3) tests per day in Training, First, Second, FEI Para Grade I&II, FEI Children and FEI Pony. Each horse is limited to a maximum of two (2) tests per day in Third, Fourth, FEI Junior, and FEI Grade III, IV and V. Each horse is limited to a maximum of one (1) test per day in FEI Young Rider, FEI U25, FEI Small Tour, FEI Medium Tour and FEI Big Tour. See: E 3.11.9

31. Every entry must have an identification number worn and visible on the show grounds. The show will not provide entry numbers to competitions. Competitors must bring their own numbers.

32. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes. (E9.7.9/E7.7)

33. Class ribbons can be picked up at the show office.

34. Class ribbons will be given to 6th place.

35. Warm-up in the dressage show rings is allowed on the move-in day from 11:00 AM until 7:00PM. Horses not stabled on the grounds may also haul-in on move-in day and school in the dressage show rings. Schooling in the dressage show rings is also allowed for one hour after the last rider in that ring on Friday. Longeing is only allowed in the dedicated longeing area.

36. The warm-up area is open one hour before the show opens each day and for one hour at the end of day on Friday and Saturday for schooling.

37. Show correspondence will be handled through email. Ride times will be posted on the Blackhorse One website once they are ready. Riders are responsible for checking the day sheets as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry form.

38. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Smoking is not allowed in the stabling areas or indoor arena.

39. Horses must leave the showgrounds within 2 hours of classes ending on the show's last day. Any arrangements to stay extra time must be made in advance with RMSJ.

40. A stabling chart will be provided at the start of the shows. It can be found at the show office and in the barns. Competitors may only use the stall and tack stall assigned to them. Any changes to stabling must be discussed with the show office.

41. The cost of stalls is \$250.00, which includes the first bedding of 5 bags of shavings. Additional shavings can be purchased at time or entry for \$ 11.50 per bag. Once stabling has been set up, and shavings delivered, additional shavings can be ordered through the Tilted Tiara website at \$12.50 per bag. Stalls may be occupied any time after 11am on Thursday. No outside shavings are allowed.

42. Tack stalls must be reserved at a cost of \$200.00 per stall.

43. The cost of day stalls is \$75.00, which includes the first bedding of 2 bags of shavings.

44. Horses that arrive early or leave late, will be charged \$50 per night extra.

45. Competitors not stabled will be charged a daily haul-in fee. The haul-in horses may not tie to stalls in the stabling area, and they should be kept by their trailer in the parking area across the road from the showgrounds.

46. Competitors will be charged a \$50 stall clean out fee. If the stall is cleaned out at the end of the event, the \$50 will be refunded.

47. Competitors with horses in the CDI or CPEDI, may request their Gold or Wild Rose horse be stabled in the FEI barns, which will be permitted as long as the horse has the necessary vaccinations and is a “companion horse” as per the FEI regulations.

48. Free parking is available across the road. Para-equestrian competitors will be given a complementary pass. No other parking within the stabling area is allowed unless a parking pass has been purchased. No exceptions.

49. Pay for Play Classes are offered with assigned ride times in the competition arenas (no judge) for schooling purposes. These classes give you 10-minutes in the show ring.

50. WDAA tests will be used in the Wild Rose Western Dressage classes.

51. WDAA tack rules will be used for the Wild Rose Western Dressage classes.

52. A fun leadline class will be offered Friday afternoon. There is no charge for this class. Entry forms will be available on the website.

53. A dog costume class will be offered Friday afternoon. There is no charge for this class. Entry forms will be available on the website.

# Gold & Wild Rose Show Awards & Special Classes

Please review the qualification criteria for show championships, awards and high-point presentations.

**A schedule for Gold and Wild Rose Award presentations will be posted at the show office. Horses are not required at the presentations, but the rider must be present and dressed in their show attire.**



# GOLD SHOW AWARDS

The average of all championship tests ridden will be used to determine the Gold Show Champions and Reserve Champions. At least two (2) tests must be ridden to be eligible for show championships. The average of the best two (2) tests in each category will be used to determine the Show Champion, and the second-highest average will be used to determine the Show Reserve Champion. Only classes specified as Championship Classes will count towards championships.

The organizing committee reserves the right to combine or split championships depending on entries.

The Rising Stars Youth Dressage Equitation Program began in British Columbia in 2015 to encourage youth participation in dressage. It has since expanded across Canada and is now an Equestrian Canada recognized program.

Tilted Tiara with the Pony Club Alberta South Region, is offering a Pony Club Stars program at the May Tilted Tiara show. The Pony Club Stars is based on the Equestrian Canada Rising Stars Program.

## Who is Eligible?

Pony Club Riders are automatically eligible for Pony Club Stars ribbons and prizes when they enter either of the following classes:

- Training, First, Second Level Pony Club Stars TOC Class
- FEI Children, FEI Pony, FEI Junior Pony Club Stars TOC Class

## PONY CLUB STARS EVENT SCHEDULE

### ***Saturday***

#### Welcome Event at Show Office

- Meet other Pony Club Stars participants
- Organize teams
- Collect your welcome package and swag bag
- Ask questions

Attendance is mandatory for Pony Club Stars participants to form teams and receive program information.

How Teams are Formed:

- Random draw
- Teams = 3 or 4 horse/rider combinations
- Similar to CDI riding time draws:
  - Rider draws their own name
  - Draws a team number
  - Continues until all riders are placed

### ***Sunday***

#### Pony Club Stars Competition Classes

- Compete in Pony Club Stars TOC dressage classes
- Judged by a technical judge and an equitation judge
- Equitation scores determine qualifying riders for the Equitation Ride-Off
- Technical scores contribute to team awards

### ***Sunday Afternoon***

#### Equitation Ride-Off & Awards

- Equitation Ride-Off:
  - The six riders with the highest equitation scores from the Pony Club Star TOC classes
  - Walk, trot, and canter in both directions under equitation evaluation only
  - Riders may be divided into groups for safety
  - Individual patterns may be requested (simple, Training level)
  - Riders are evaluated on position and effectiveness at walk, trot, and canter
  - No additional fee to participate in the Ride-Off.

#### Awards Presentation:

- Team Awards, based on the average of the technical scores – end of the day on Sunday
- Top two teams receive ribbons and prizes.
- Equitation Champion & Reserve Champion - end of the day on Sunday

# TILTED TIARA TERRIFIC CLASSIC

This year, the Tilted Tiara Terrific Classic will be run as five separate divisions.  
**Each horse/rider can only enter one division.**

## JUNIOR MINI CLASSIC

- Open to Junior riders only. Horses and ponies must not have shown over a course of fences of 2'0" or higher at any show or event prior to January 1st of the current year.
- Dressage test to include walk, trot, canter, lengthening and leg yields.
- Fences not to exceed 18".
- Prize Money \$300.
- Medals and prize money to 6th place.

## ADULT MINI CLASSIC

- Open to Adult riders only. Horses and ponies must not have shown over a course of fences of 2'0" or higher at any show or event prior to January 1st of the current year. Horses must not have competed above 1st level at any show or event prior to January 1st of the current year.
- Dressage test to include walk, trot, canter, lengthening and leg yields.
- Fences not to exceed 18".
- Prize Money \$400
- Medals and prize money to 6th place.

## YOUNG HORSE MINI CLASSIC

- Open to 5-6-7 year old horses.
- Dressage test to include walk, trot, canter, lengthening and leg yields.
- Fences not to exceed 18".
- Prize Money \$400
- Medals and prize money to 6th place.

---

## TERRIFIC BABY-GREEN CLASSIC

- Open to horses that have not shown over a course of fences of 2'0" or higher at any show or event prior to January 1st of the current year.
- This division is intended for dressage horses that have not competed in jumping events.
- Dressage test to include simple or flying changes, half-pass, mediums in addition to above movements.
- Fences not to exceed 18"
- Prize Money \$2,000
- Medals and prize money to 10th place.

## ORIGINAL TERRIFIC CLASSIC

- Open to all horses and riders.
- Dressage test to include simple or flying changes, half-pass, mediums in addition to above movements.
- Fences not to exceed 30"
- Prize Money \$2,000
- Medals and prize money to 10th place

# TILTED TIARA TERRIFIC CLASSIC

## COMPETITION FORMAT

The Terrific Classic is a two-phase competition that combines dressage and jumping, requiring riders to compete on the same horse for both phases.

### **Phase 1: Dressage Test**

- The dressage tests will be available on the Tilted Tiara website one month before the event.
- Riders can opt to include bonus movements to earn extra points.

### **Phase 2: Jumping Round**

- Scored on a "match the clock" format while minimizing knockdowns
- Maximum jump heights:
  - Mini-Classics: Up to 18"
  - Baby Green Up to 18"
  - Terrific Classic: Up to 30"
- Riders can earn extra points by choosing a bonus jump at the end of the round,
- Medal presentations and prize distribution will take place Saturday evening at Goby's Grill.

# Bio Security Guidelines

Please review the rules and regulations section carefully as we have made a number of updates for 2026.

**Updates and changes have been highlighted for your convenience.**



## **Guidelines**

Tilted Tiara and RMSJ are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all participants and their horses. All horses are required to have a vaccination record submitted to the show before arrival at the show grounds. All participants are required to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and show horses are at an increased risk for contracting and spreading contagious diseases.

A nighttime curfew will be in place each evening at 10:00 p.m. Noise must be kept to a minimum in the barn/tent area, and unnecessary lights will be turned off.

Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the 14-days prior to the start of the show must have their attending veterinarian contact TD Equine Veterinary Group prior to entry at the show grounds. All horses while on the showgrounds must have their temperature taken and recorded on a daily basis during the show.

Trainers/owners/persons responsible must immediately notify the show office of a horse with an elevated temperature (defined as 101.5°F if the horse is not on an NSAID, or 101.0°F if the horse is on an NSAID or other temperature-suppressing medication). If a horse has an elevated temperature, it must stay in its assigned stall. If the horse has no other clinical signs, it may be allowed to remain in its stall, and a temperature will be taken 1-2 hours later. If the horse remains febrile (exhibiting an elevated temperature as described above) or shows signs of an infectious disease, the show veterinarian or show office must be contacted again.

Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area.

No horse in isolation will be permitted to compete. Horses in isolation will be released based on a collective decision by Tilted Tiara show management and the TD Equine Veterinary Group.

Tilted Tiara reserves the right to require isolation, within a timely manner (less than 2 hrs), and to require testing of any horse with a fever and/or clinical signs for EHV-1 and other infectious diseases.

## **Do your part in keeping your equine partners safe!**

- Do not bring sick horses or horses with a fever or clinical signs of illness within the last 7 days to RMSJ until the issue is resolved.
- When arriving at the show grounds, once the horse is stabled and at rest, a first temperature check should occur before leaving the stall for initial work. This initial check should occur within 3 to 6 hours of arrival.
- If an initial temperature check reveals a fever (defined as 101.5°F if the horse is not on a NSAID or 101.1°F if the horse is on a NSAID or other temperature-suppressing medication) show management must be notified immediately. The horse must remain in the stall until the show veterinarian takes a subsequent temperature.
- Please take your horses temperature twice daily, if your horse becomes ill while at RMSJ, please immediately notify the show veterinarian, and competition management. The single most important thing that can be done is to isolate sick horses as soon as possible and provide them with appropriate care.
- Extreme caution should be taken by those handling/riding horses to avoid contamination between horses. Tack should not be shared across horses. Riders transitioning from one horse to another should wash their hands with soap and water or use a disinfectant. Materials used to care for horses, e.g., towels or rags for wiping noses, should not be shared between horses.
- **A horse health declaration form confirming adherence to these bio-security guidelines will be available on the entry system. This declaration must be completed and submitted no earlier than 48 hours prior to arrival, and within 1 hour of arrival at the show grounds.**

## FEI Vaccination Requirements

When your veterinarian administers an equine influenza vaccine to an FEI Horse, they must update the vaccination details on the FEI HorseApp in addition to recording them in the horse's FEI Passport.

### Key Requirements (FEI Veterinary Regulations):

- Same-day entry: Vaccination details must be entered into the FEI HorseApp on the day of administration.
- Complete information: The entry must include the vaccine name and batch number.
- Veterinarian presence: The veterinarian must be present with the horse at the time of entry.

## FEI Horse Health Requirements

All CDI horses stabled in the FEI barns must adhere to the latest FEI Horse Health Protocols as outlined in Articles 1029 and 1031 of the FEI Veterinary Regulations.

### Key Requirements for ALL Horses Competing at FEI Events:

- Pre-Arrival Temperature Monitoring
- Record two daily temperature readings for three days prior to arrival at the event.
- Enter these readings in the FEI HorseApp.
- Horse Health FEI Self-Certification Form
- Complete and submit the form via the FEI HorseApp the day before or the day of arrival at the CDI.
- On-Site Temperature Monitoring
- Take and record twice-daily temperature readings for each horse throughout the CDI using your own thermometer.
- Enter the measurements directly in the FEI HorseApp.

Failure to comply with these regulations may result in penalties or disqualification.
